Total Mobilization Asked by Chief of Legion at Armistice Day Rites

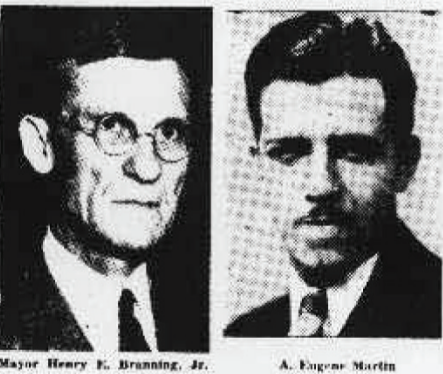

Boys Stop First Cavalry

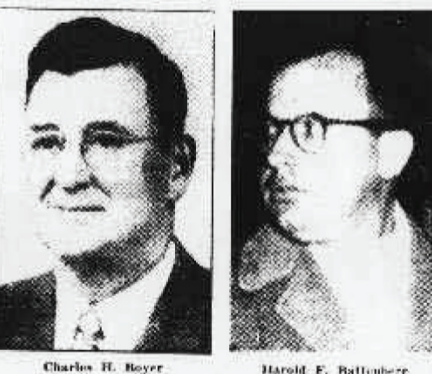
But on the right, elements of the First Cavalry met what a spokesman called "very" courageous resistance, only 300 yards north of the town of Hwang, which was being shelled.

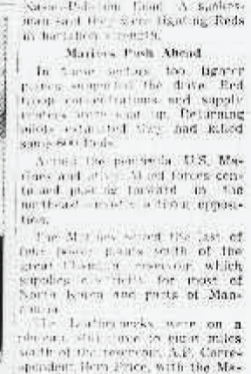
