

Hush Falls Over Battlefield As Shooting Ends

SEOUL (AP)—Shooting stopped along the Korean battlefield at 10 p.m. tonight (8 a.m. Monday CDT), bringing to an abrupt halt 37 months of death and destruction.

Randolph said all firing stopped at 9:43 p.m. A few seconds after 10 p.m. wild yells broke out from American G.I.s.

South Korean artillerymen tried to muffle the Red guns once and for all with a time-on-target barrage.

The last Communist plane shot down was bagged at 12:55 p.m. more than two hours after the truce was signed.

WARNINGS FOLLOW ARMISTICE

Clark Says Allies To Stay as Reds Boast of Victory

PANMUNJOM (AP)—Generals of the UN command and the Red armies signed today at long last a compromise armistice in the bitter, three-year Korean War.

UN TO GIVE BACK 74,000

Communists to Return 3,313 American G.I. Prisoners

MUNSAN (AP) — The secret record of the Panmunjom truce negotiations released today showed that the Communists have told the Allies they will return 12,763 prisoners of war—including 3,313 Americans.

The Eighth Army commander, Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor, said the armistice was "just a suspension of hostilities, which may or may not be preparatory to permanent peace."

Reds to Hold Most of Land Seized in Bulge Offensive

TOKYO (AP)—The new military demarcation line agreed to by Allied and Red negotiators in secret sessions at Panmunjom gave the Communist almost all the ground they won recently in the Kumsong bulge in their greatest offensive in two years, a map released by Gen. Mark W. Clark's headquarters showed today.

Ike Asks Congress Give \$200 Million in Korea Aid

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower today formally requested Congress to provide an initial 200 million dollars for Korean relief. He said security interests of the United States "clearly indicate the need to act promptly."
