LOST IN BLIZZARD

Western Air Express Plane With Five Persons on Board Vanishes West of Albuquerque.

HEAVY SNOW MAKES HUNT MORE DIFFICULT Search Will Cover Territory Where Airplane Carried Eight Persons to Death Recently.

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M., Oct. 28.—(AP)—Water, closing down over the mountains which form the backbone of the Continental Divide, today concealed beneath a blanket of lowering storm clouds and snow the fate of a Western Air Express plane, lost with five persons aboard.

The plane, an airplane, with two passengers and a crew of three, disappeared yesterday morning somewhere along the 100-mile stretch of the Western Air Express route between Navajo, Ariz., and Albuquerque. It is believed to have been forced down by bitter weather when west of the Rocky Mountain front range, bringing snow and rain which caused the pilot to crash.
